

Ondansetron

Other names: Zofran.

What is it and how does it work?

A medicine that is given to prevent and/ or to treat nausea and vomiting caused by chemotherapy and/or radiotherapy.

What does it look like and how is it given?

A solution or a tablet that is taken by mouth (oral).

Short-term side effects (within 24 hours)

- Headache
- Hot flashes or a head that feels
 warm
- Warm sensations

Long-term side effects

Constipation

Special instructions

- If your child vomits within 30 minutes after taking the medicine, please check prinsesmaximacentrum.nl/regimens under the heading 'Medicine' to see what you should do.
- Keep an eye on your child's stool.

Specifics

It might be necessary to adjust your child's diet, or to administer a laxative.
